Climate Ambassadors are committed to a bilateral climate change and climate justice agenda that addresses challenges for communities, businesses, and society at large on both sides of the border.

Strengthen your ability to pursue a career working on binational climate change issues, including through access to information about unique professional opportunities at organizations committed to a new climate agenda.



#### THE NETWORK

Meet and engage with like-minded students in California and Mexico to exchange perspectives, organize bilateral activities, and build cross-border connections with organizations in academia, business, government, and civil society.



#### THE INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Gain experience and insight through an internship with a company, government agency, or NGO affiliated with the network. We have worked with organizations such as World Environment Center, Iniciativa Climática de México, WRI Mexico, Elemental Excelerator, and more. Internships will offer students an understanding of how organizations seek to meet their climate and clean energy goals.



#### THE MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

Interact with climate change experts from the educational, government, and private sectors, who will share their expertise and offer the Ambassador's guidance on how to pursue action and careers in the new climate economy and society. We have 30+ mentors from the University of California and renowned Mexican Institutions.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

- Between 18 and 24 years old
- Undergraduate only (from junior year or 5th semester)
- Intermediate-level English and Spanish language skills
- Submit a cover letter(one page max / Arial 12, line spacing 1.15) that describes your skills, objectives, and determination to succeed as a Climate Ambassador
- Recommendation Letter
- Commit to spending at least 8-10 hours a month engaging with fellow Climate Ambassadors and mentors in the network. An additional time commitment is required for internships, to be determined on a case-by-case basis.





### Ambassador Program

Since Fall 2022, 50 Climate Ambassadors have joined the initiative to begin defining a strong binational network and a climate agenda that will address current and future challenges for communities, business, and society at large on both sides of the border. Ambassadors are organized in 4 different committees, where they exercise leadership in organizing and making decisions around the diverse activities of the initiative.
